## Excursion details



### Introductory Tour of Chester

The tour is designed to help you find your way around the city and to introduce you to some of the main sights and attractions including the walls, the Rows, the famous clock, the town hall and the cathedral. With 2,000 years of history, there are lots of treasures to see in our great city.



### Chirk Castle Excursion

A stark symbol of power, Chirk Castle was completed in 1310 during the reign of the conquering Edward I to subdue the last princes of Wales. With over 700 years of history, and as the last castle from this period still lived in today, Chirk Castle's many occupants have left behind lavish interiors and a beautiful and eclectic collection.



### Traditional Pub Meal

British pub food is very traditional, hearty and enjoyed in a casual and often informal setting. There're a few pub grub classics that can be found in almost every pub across the UK that just scream British classics and that you should try when visiting.



### Chester Races

Chester Racecourse, known as the Roodee, is (according to official records) the oldest racecourse still in use in England. Horse racing at Chester dates back to the early 16th century. It is also thought to be the smallest racecourse of significance in England at 1 mile and 1 furlong long.



### North Wales Excursion

Enjoy the history of the walled town of Conwy, from its big castle to the smallest house in the UK.

With views towards Snowdonia, Bodnant is one of the most beautiful gardens in the UK occupying an area of over 80 acres.



### Shrewsbury Excursion (Suggestion)

Shrewsbury is Shropshire's county town and is perfectly placed in the centre of our rural county. Shrewsbury's town centre is almost an island, encircled by a meandering loop of the River Severn. Within its loop are distinctive churches, Shrewsbury Castle, beautiful timber-framed houses and a sweeping riverside parkland known as the Quarry or Quarry Park. **This excursion is a suggestion. ### Historical Pub Tour

### Port Sunlight Excursion

Built at the end of the 19th century, this unique garden village was originally built as a home for workers at the Lever soap factory. The Lady Lever Art Gallery was opened in 1922 and houses the personal collection of the 1st Lord Leverhulme; it was named in memory of his wife.



### River Boat Cruise

Enjoy a relaxing and informative cruise along the River Dee in Chester. The perfect way to spend an afternoon.
